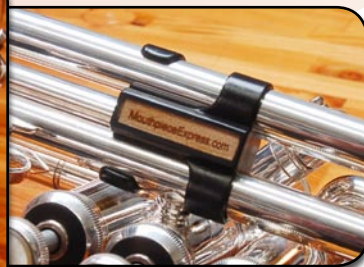
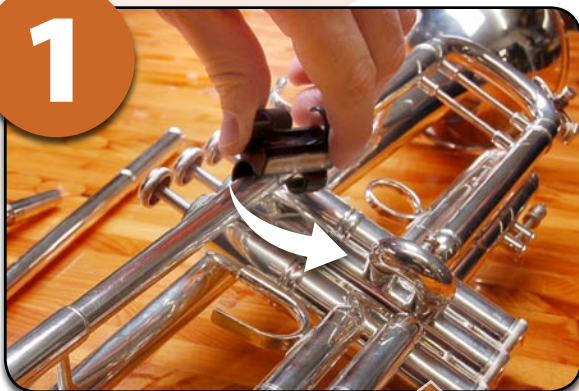
How-to use the PipeBuddie

**START
HERE**



Gather your materials. You'll need the PipeBuddie system, your horn, your new leadpipe, and your favorite mouthpiece.

1



Position the PipeBuddie Leadpipe Stabilizer so it sits between the leadpipe and casing brace. Twist it counter-clockwise to snap it into place.

Place the new leadpipe perpendicular to the Leadpipe Stabilizer.

Gently turn the new leadpipe clockwise to snap it into place.

Position the leadpipes so their mouthpiece receivers are even.

3a



Slide the crook from the old leadpipe.

Slide the crook into the new leadpipe.

Place the **PipeBuddie Coupler** into the old leadpipe keeping the open end (for the mouthpiece) positioned in front of the new leadpipe.

Slide your mouthpiece into the open end of the **PipeBuddie Coupler** leading into the new leadpipe. Make sure it snugly fits into the new leadpipe.



6



Test it out!

You should now be able to play your trumpet and test out your new leadpipe as if were attached to your trumpet.

IMPORTANT:

Follow these steps when removing the PipeBuddie from your horn to avoid damage to your trumpet or the PipeBuddie.

1



Remove the mouthpiece from the **Coupler** to relieve the tension between the **Coupler** and the leadpipe.

2



Remove the PipeBuddie Coupler.

3



Slide the crook from the lower tuning slide receiver keeping the new leadpipe intact. This should relieve tension on the new leadpipe making it easier to remove it from the **Leadpipe Stabilizer**.

Now, simply return the crook to it's proper position and you're done. Once you're finished, the **PipeBuddie** may be returned to MouthpieceExpress.com for a full refund.
